Interviews

- Normally in January or February
- Panel and/or MMI Style
- Written work
- Dexterity evidence
- You may get short notice, so don't panic!
- Read the email CAREFULLY and make sure you bring everything they need you to (Exam certificates, Passport, photos, etc.)



MMIs

- Normally between 6-9 stations, lasting between 5 and 9 minutes each
- Stations include:
 - Interaction with actors
 - Discussion of ethical issues
 - Work Experience & Personal Statement
 - News & Current Affairs
 - Can be really random





Example MMI questions/stations

- Do you like libraries and why do you think we should have libraries?
- How would you make your GP surgery more friendly for deaf people?
- Last Week a patient came to see you. You misdiagnosed him and consequently he died. His next of kin, Sandy Smith, came to see you today, go and talk to them.
- Watch this video of a simple first aid procedure then perform it on your neighbour, Alex, who has just been involved in an accident in their home. You may only watch the video once.
- You have just reversed over your neighbour's cat, knock on her door and explain to her what happened.

BMAT: UK

- Brighton & Sussex Medical School

- It is a 2 hour paper based test that is offered once a year in September and October
- It tests your ability to apply scientific and mathematical knowledge, as well as problem solving, critical thinking and written communication skills













UKCAT/UCAT

- It tests verbal, quantitative and abstract reasoning, as well as decision analysis and situational judgement
- Who uses it? University of Aberdeen, Barts and The London School of Medicine and Dentistry, University of Birmingham, Cardiff University, University of Dundee, Durham University, University of East Anglia, University of Edinburgh, University of Exeter, University of Glasgow, Hull York Medical School, Keele University, King's College London, University of Leicester, University of Liverpool, University of Manchester, Newcastle University, University of Nottingham, Plymouth University, Queen's University Belfast, St George's, University of London, University of Sheffield, University of Southampton, University of St Andrews and University of Warwick Graduate Entry Medical Degree.
- Key dates:

May-registration period opens

Testing – July till beginning October

- 2 shortcomings which you will need to overcome to be a good dentist/vet/doctor?
- What are the negative aspects of being a doctor? vet? dentist?
- How do you cope with stress? criticism?
- When did you change your mind about a strong opinion you held?
