Edexcel GCSE Music Exam:

Listening Paper:

- Single word answers
- Longer Phrase answers
- Rhythmic and melodic dictations
- Extended answers

Revision tips:

- 1. When completing past papers, do a question and then use the mark scheme on the website to mark it immediately. Don't do a whole paper in one sitting at this stage.
- 2. Use mnemonics to remember key content for topics.
- 3. Remember some questions only have one possible answer (e.g. rhythmic device is always syncopation)

How to structure your answers:

- In extended answers make sure you are only commenting on the elements of music you have been asked for.
- o In extended answers you may wish to divide your page into columns or squares, one for each element.
- o Make sure you give sufficient detail e.g. not guitar but **electric** guitar; not drum but **timpani** drum.

Golden Rules:

- Answer every question, never leave one blank.
- Use the reading time and time between questions carefully and cleverly.
- Check your work at the end of the exam and make sure you haven't left any blank answers.
