Here pupils learn how careers and life choices combine, by looking at how to manage budgets and financial commitments within the constraints of your 'salary'.



<u>www.fasttomato.com</u> is a personality profiling website, where pupils can complete 4 different personality questionnaires, which generate a profile and career suggestions. To access this website you must "register with a code" and enter the code associated with the tutor group of your child (see below). Then you can create your own ID and password.
