





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ASSESSMENT:

The suitable candidates will be invited to an assessment day.

This will involve:

- Skill and technical knowledge demonstration in their chosen art form
- Interview with either the Head Teacher or a Deputy Head, the Director of Creative Arts and an Arts Lead during which they will be expected to talk convincingly about their commitment and enthusiasm to the Creative Arts.
- Psychology baseline test.

HOW TO APPLY:

Candidates should:

- Complete an application form and attach a letter summarising their Creative Art's activities and achievements over the last two years (no more than one side of A4 written by the student).
- In support of their CV, there should be a creative arts specialist reference and a behaviour/character reference (these may be from a present coach/teacher from the last two years).
- Submit video footage of Drama Monologue or Music Solo of their choice. For Art, a picture of their current work
