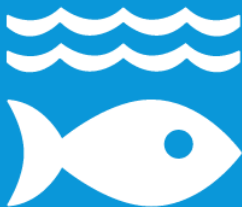

4. What barriers stand in the way of resolving the issue?
5. How you would attempt to resolve the issue.

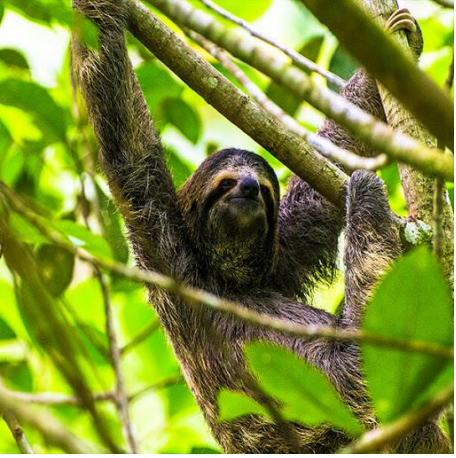

You are also advised to save the relevant dates for the Costa Rica trip.

The dates are as follows:

- **Under 18s Costa Rica Rainforest Conservation: 31 July 2021 - 14 August 2021**
- **Over 18s Costa Rica Community Development Project: 24 July 2021 - 7 August 2021**

You must have a valid passport – see details in the T&Cs

Finally, you will not be shortlisted to win without parental permission & confirmation that you are available to take part in the Costa Rica Project.
