

<u>GCSEs</u>

- GCSEs changed between 2015-2018
- Grading system 1-9
- Rigorous curriculum focusing on core skills (numeracy & literacy)
 - English: SPaG moved from 5% 20%
 - Maths: Learning formulas
 - Science: 20% of questions require maths skills





Science Information

Set 1: Separate Science (Biology, Chemistry and Physics) (Students are awarded 3 GCSE qualifications)

Sets 2-6: Combined Science – Trilogy

(This is equivalent to **2 GCSE qualifications** covering content from all 3 sciences)

The current link between maths and science sets will cease at the end of year 9 and will have no impact on GCSE maths or science setting.

Combined Science <u>can</u> access A level sciences if they meet the MER.



Year 9 Science Exams

All students in Year 9 will sit Science Exams in the Summer Term.

The results of these exams will determine the Science Set that students will be placed into for GCSE.

They will also, therefore, determine the exam pathway that they will follow at KS4; Separate Sciences or Combined Science.

These exams are **extremely important** and students must revise thoroughly in preparation for them.

The dates of these exams in the summer term are to be confirmed depending on the GCSE and A Level arrangements.

The English Baccalaureate (EBacc.)

The EBacc is a set of subjects at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers.

The EBacc is made up of the subjects which are considered essential to many degrees and open many doors in the future. To achieve the EBacc, students must take the following combination of subjects:

Mathematics

English Language

Separate or Combined Science

A Modern Foreign Language

A Humanity – History or Geography

(both can still be taken)

Studies show that studying subjects included in the EBacc provides students with:

- Greater opportunities in further education
- Increases the likelihood that a student will stay on in fulltime
 education
- Improves performance in English and Maths.

We therefore encourage all students to consider following an EBacc pathway to ensure they keep their options open for further study and future careers.



Student Pathways

Typically, EBacc and non-EBacc subject combinations may look like this, although other subject combinations are obviously available:
