#### Headline news on results

#### 3-year averages:

- 90%+ A\*-C
- Over three-quarters of Y13 A Levels graded A\*-B
- 45% of grades awarded at A\* or A
- More than half Y13s applying to university secured elite Russell Group university places (RG only7% of all universities)
- Results in the top 1% of all schools for student progress nationally.


# Key messages for the year ahead

  - Effort Grade 3 = imbalance











#### **Effort Grades**

- 1 = Outstanding
- 2 = Very Good

- 4 = Cause for concern
- 5 = Unacceptable

- Average grade 51.71 (A\*/A)





















#### Gordon's Sixth Form students will prioritise:


- Attendance & Punctuality

## Good study habits

- Establishing good study habits early is crucial
   Tips
- 1. Do it now!
  - 1. First A level exam on 20th May 2019 27 teaching weeks
- 2. Use study periods properly
- Make the most of study spaces: study room in House and the Library
- 4. Communication with teachers
  - 1. Act on Next Steps Advice!
- 5. Be organised could be worth a grade per subject
  - E.g. Planner
  - E.g. Folder structure / dividers



### Working smart

- If you can, be informed by the Year 12 exam paper. What went well? Where did you lose marks?
- Allocate a subject & identify tasks for each study period: be effective.
- Hand the phone in. Save yourself from distractions.


