Curriculum


- Students mainly take 3 A Levels. Although some take 4.



- 4. Next Steps Advice provided on some reports



Effort Grades

- 1 = Outstanding
- 2 = Very Good
- 3 = Good but occasionally inconsistent
- 4 = Cause for concern
- 5 = Unacceptable

Typical Year Group Effort grade profile

- Top 25% = Below 1.5
- Middle 50% = 1.5 to 2.0
- Bottom 25% = Above 2.0







Effort is King

- Bottom 20 Y12s for effort 2019.
- Average effort grade 2.61
- Average grade 27.17 (C/D)
- Top 20 Y12s for effort 2019
- Average effort grade 1.27
- Average grade 44.13 (A/B)







Medical Centre

Day Students

- If students feel unwell, they should report to the School Office.
- Students may have a short period of rest in the School Office before returning to lessons, or they will be sent to the School Medical Centre for assessment.
- Simple over-the-counter medications may be given (provided parental consent is in place) or parents will be called to collect the child if absolutely necessary.

Residential Students and those with IHCPs

- As above during lesson time, except that students who are unfit to return to lessons will be looked after in the school Medical Centre.
- Outside lesson time, Residential Boarders have access to the school Medical Centre or on-call Nurse for all their medical needs.



Covid-19

Current Government guidance for 18s and under:

- Not recommended they test unless directed by a health professional
- If they have symptoms and a high temperature stay at home until they feel better and temperature has returned to normal

Symptoms identified at school

Attendance – knowing where students are

- 6th Form students are permitted to visit local shops on foot during Private Study periods and break times (30 min time limit)

- Once students have left site for more than 30 mins, they are assumed to have returned home and must not return to site other than for a supervised activity by request
- Students must not use their cars until they leave at the end of the day (after P6)
