A reminder of the UCAS process



1. UNIFROG

- We use Unifrog until October 2022.
- On Unifrog students will do their course searches and create a short list of universities you are considering.
- They will draft their personal statement on here too.
- Their subject references will be written on here.



2. Create a UCAS account

- Tomorrow students will start their UCAS account by registering and inputting their personal details and your education.
- They can complete all sections apart from personal statement.
- DO NOT write the personal statement on UCAS as it times out and you lose everything.



3. YOUR UNIVERSITY CHOICES

Every student can **choose 5 courses** on UCAS.

Aim to divide them into;

Aspirational choice /realistic choice/insurance choice.

Make sure the insurance choice is:

- Completely achievable in terms of UCAS points or grades
- A place you will be happy studying you must visit to make sure.



4. YOUR REFERENCE

- Once students have completed their personal statement and uploaded it on UCAS, tutors will write their reference.
- 1. First the subject teachers are asked to write a reference for you on Unifrog.
- 2. Tutors will draw on this when writing the overall tutor reference.
- 3. When the tutor has completed the reference the application is ready to go!



5. Your offers

- Students will receive one of the following responses:
- Conditional: This offer is based upon attaining the entry requirements set by the university and specific course
- Unconditional: This offer means that you have a place on that course at that university if you want it.
- Unsuccessful: Unfortunately you have not been accepted by this university. The university will either provide feedback at this stage, or you can contact them directly to discuss feedback

Once offers are in

FIVE AND TWO

- Now narrow down the five to the final two
- Students need to make sure that they are happy to attend both the Firm and Insurance choices they could end up at either of them!
- Once students have put a university as their FIRM choice and get the grades to go, they cannot then change your mind and choose the insurance option.
- To make the best use of the insurance choice, this university should have lower grade requirements. The insurance choice should act as a backup.

6. FINANCE

Universities and colleges can charge fees of up to £9,250. Tuition fee loans will also increase with inflation.

- Tuition fee loans lend students up to £9,250 and is paid directly to the course provider.
- They pay this back after the course and when they earn over a certain amount (currently £25,725 per year).
- Maintenance loans may depend on the household income, where students study, where they live and for how long they study.

SUMMARY

- RESEARCH: Check the grades/UCAS points you will need to get accepted. Be realistic about what you can achieve.
 - Check that there are no GCSE subjects/specific GCSE grades or other qualifications required.
- Work on your personal statement you need to evidence claims and show why they should choose you.
- Have an insurance choice. You might want options later on.




The application form

- Personal details and additional information includes funding, scholarships and residential options
- Choices can choose up to 5 options in no order
- Education all grades you have received from secondary school onwards and predicted grades
- Employment information on any paid part or full-time job
- Statement your personal statement
- Reference a written recommendation from a teacher or tutor.
- View all details before you pay and send the application (£22.50 for one course and £27 for anything more)







Personal statement

- 4,000 characters or 47 lines
- A structured statement all about you and why you are suitable for your chosen course
- · Can be used during the admissions process
- Take your time as some courses are very competitive





How to structure the statement

Why do you want to study the course?

What have you done that makes you suitable for the course?

What else have you done?





What should you include?









- Why do you want to study this subject?
- Think about what inspired you
- Any reading or research? (EPQ)
- What experience do you have?
- What skills have you developed that will help you on the course?
- What do you hope to gain from the course?
- What else do you do? (Sports)

Activity

What you've done

Benefit

What skills it has given you

Course

How these relate to your course





Example

As captain of the school football team, I have developed excellent team working skills. I also feel that playing football has provided me with the experience of successfully balancing my academic and social life and I plan to continue this balance whilst at university.













Do:

- Detailed research
- Take time and plan properly
- Include academic qualities as well as hobbies
- Be positive
- Check spelling
- Print a copy to check for errors and ask for feedback

Do not:

- Give excuses
- · Copy others
- Leave it to the last minute
- Name universities
- · Sell yourself short
- Waffle make sure it's relevant to your chosen degree
- · Lie!
