INSIGHT TALKS



Baroness Sayeeda Warsi: What it means to be British Tuesday 28th February at 6:00pm in the Chapel

A lawyer, a businesswoman, a campaigner and a cabinet minister, Sayeeda Warsi has had many roles, but she is best known for being the first Muslim to serve in a British cabinet. In August 2014 she resigned from Government citing the Government's "morally indefensible" policy on Gaza.

One of five girls born to immigrants of Pakistani origin in Dewsbury, West Yorkshire, Sayeeda studied law at Leeds University, going on to work for the Crown Prosecution Service before setting up her own legal practice.

U18 FORMAT

- Two pools of five teams. Round robin within the pool
- Seven minutes each way (one minute for half time)
- Pool matches start at 17:00
- Knock out matches start at 20:15
- The presentation will be at 21:00

RULES

1. Each side shall consist of seven players, drawn from a squad of no more than twelve.
2. Unlimited rolling substitutions can be made during stoppages in play by letting the referee know.
3. Each match will be of seven minutes duration each way. The knockout games will also be seven minutes each way. There will be one minute between halves. Normal Sevens' rules will apply.
4. A red card (or 2x yellow cards) will result in a minimum two match suspension, which could be increased at the discretion of the Tournament Director and the Head of Referees, depending on the severity of the offence(s) as described by the match referee.
5. The winners and runners up of each group will go forward into the Semi-Finals of the Cup competition. Teams finishing 3rd will go forward into the Plate competition.
6. Points: 3 points for a win, 1 point for a draw, 0 points for a loss.
If equal on group points then:
 - Greatest Points Difference (PD)
 - If equal PD then greatest Points For (PF)
 - If equal PF then coin toss
7. If the scores are level at full-time in the Semi-Finals or Finals, then extra periods of five minutes will be played until one team scores.
8. As a final reminder, all conversions are drop goals and the scoring team kicks off. One player from the conceding team should stay behind the posts to retrieve the ball.

SCOREBOARDS

First named teams on the programme will be 'Gordon's' on the scoreboards. Second name schools will be 'Visitors'. This does not apply when playing Gordon's School.

DIRECTIONS

From the M3: Exit at Junction 3 and at the roundabout join the A322 signposted to Lightwater, Woking and Guildford. Travel along the dual carriageway to the roundabout and take the first exit onto the A319, Bagshot Road. Visitor parking and pitches are on the left just before the footbridge, on the opposite side of the road to the main school.

From Woking: Leave Woking via the A3046 following signs for Chobham, M3 and Bagshot. Travel for 2.5 miles to Chobham and at the roundabout turn right to travel through Chobham High Street. At the next roundabout turn left onto the A319, Bagshot Road and travel for a further two miles. Visitor parking and pitches are on the right just after the footbridge, on the opposite side of the road to the main school.

From Guildford: Leave Guildford via the A322 following signs for the M3 and Bagshot. Travel for eight miles, remaining on the A322, and after passing through West End village you will see the School on your right. You cannot enter the School from here so continue to the roundabout and take the third exit onto the A319, Bagshot Road. Visitor parking and pitches are on the left just before the footbridge, on the opposite side of the road to the main school.
