

The UCAS Process - an overview

- 1. Students create an account in summer term
- 2. They add 5 choices of courses/universities that they think they can access based on their predicted grades
- 3. They need to write a personal statement to convince admissions tutors to offer them a place
 - Deadline for this is by October half term 2020
- 4. We write a reference for them during October/November
- 5. I send the application off with the students
 - UK deadline 15 January 2021 but my deadline is November 2020
- 6. We wait to receive offers
- 7. Students then narrow down their 5 choices to final two by May: a firm choice and then an insurance choice



- 2. 28th April UCAS Fair in Winchester all Y12 going
- 3. Attend Open Days at Universities of interest
- 4. Higher Education meeting for parents (in June)
- 5. Higher Education Day (in June for students): personal statement writing workshop
- 6. Log on to UCAS and begin the application
- AS/A Level results day 13th August 2020 these go on the UCAS application and form the basis for UCAS predicted grades

Apprenticeships: The Context

- Government target 3 million apprenticeships starting in England between 2015 and 2020
- Apprenticeship Levy introduced April 2017
- Public Sector target at least 2.3 per cent of the workforce in public sector bodies in England will have to be apprentices by 2020






Apprenticeship starts in England (Thousands)


