


Why go to university?

- A degree is now a requirement for a large number of professions
- It improves career prospects and earning potential
- A recent report from the Department for Business, Innovation & Skills stated that workers
 with degrees earn 27% more than those workers with only A-levels over a lifetime, this is
 on average £210,000
- Students will develop many important and transferable skills that will help them in the future









Phase 1 Unifrog: February – June

- HE launch event- tonight! Focus from now on should be on research.
- March UCAS Fair
- Attend Open Days at Universities of interest may be virtual for now
- Higher Education meeting for parents (in June)
- Higher Education Day (in June for students): personal statement writing workshop
- Log on to UCAS and begin the application



The UCAS Process; second phase June – December 2022

- Students create a UCAS account in summer term
- They add **5 choices** of courses/universities that they think they can access based on their predicted grades
- They need to write **one personal statement** to convince admissions tutors to offer them a place
 - Deadline for this is by October half term 2022
- We write a reference for them during October/November
- We send the application off with the students
 - UK deadline typically 15 January 2023 but my deadline is November 2022
- We wait to receive offers
- Students then narrow down their 5 choices to final two by May: a firm choice and then an insurance choice

4,000 characters or 47 lines

You can provide evidence of work experience /additional activities

Your opportunity to speak directly to the person deciding on your application — why you want to study the subject and what makes you the right person for the course





Statement Preparation

- 80% academic 20% extracurricular
- Research
- Evidence is key
- Spelling and grammar accuracy
- Be clear with your language
- It will take multiple attempts to write
- Don't overuse quotes







Architects design new buildings and the spaces around them, and work on the restoration and conservation of existing buildings.








