

#### Who can apply?

This programme is aimed at those in the later years of full-time secondary, sixth form or college education who are keen to get an introduction to what a career in banking and financial services may be like.

The Work Experience placement takes place throughout June, July and August yearly. Specific details regarding each opportunity are available on the application page. Each location can house numerous placements, so please apply for the location closest to you and state a preference (if you have one) for a specific area during the application process.

Please note, knowledge of the banking and financial services sector is not required for you to apply.

To be considered for the programme, you will:

- Be in full-time education at secondary school, sixth form or college at the time of the work experience commencing (June/August the following year from the point of application).
- Be keen and motivated to find out more about HSBC and be prepared to complete the application process, which will include some online questions and, if successful, a telephone interview.

#### What will you learn

This programme has been designed to give you a realistic taste of what the world of work is truly like. It will provide you with an insight into what it is like to work for a global bank, and hopefully assist you in deciding your future career options.

Over the course of the programme, we typically offer:

- Mixture of hybrid, virtual and in person hands-on work experience
- Feedback on how you can develop yourself
- Tips on recruitment processes for the future
- Opportunities to network with a range of HSBC employees, with a platform to ask as many questions as you want to help with your understanding of what working for HSBC is like and even realise potential future ambitions

#### How to apply

Please apply via the website: <u>HSBC Work Experience opportunities</u>
Opportunities will be on the site in Late November/Early December this year.
You will be re-directed to a jobs page which holds all of the available locations for the Work Experience programme. We encourage you to choose and apply for a location to which you can reasonably commute. This programme can be highly competitive, so we recommend applying as early as possible to avoid disappointment. Applications will close when all placements are filled, and we will not be able to offer placements in locations not listed.

Please ensure you obtain prior approval from your school, sixth-form or college to undertake this work experience as it falls within the standard school/college term-time.

#### What to expect

Your placement will consist of shadowing HSBC colleagues, with a platform to ask questions to help you understand not only what the area you are placed in does, but also what it is like to work at HSBC UK. You will get to know more about us; our values, our history and exactly what we do – alongside gaining an insight into actual jobs that you would be doing should you decide to work for us in the future. Throughout the course of the week you will have the full support of experienced

Throughout the course of the week you will have the full support of experienced managers, and be given an opportunity to work on a live project; sharing your ideas with colleagues and managers.

## Demystifying online application processes

Application processes can be intimidating. There are so many stages, and so many requests for information. But why are you asked for so much and how do you pass them?


- Prepare
- Research
- Review the job description for the role you're applying for
- Carefully review the instructions at each stage
- Review everything you do
- Remember your answers are checked and reviewed
- Fill out as much detail as possible



- Rush
- Avoid Diversity data information
- Apply for too many at once
- Start a process without adequate time
- Get frustrated
- Jump straight in

### **CV** Tips



Up to date and correct contact details

Work history, including dates, titles and key duties. Make sure to tailor them to the role and include achievements.

Ensure your CV is thoroughly checked for spelling, grammar and formatting

Be aware of your CV length!

HSBC uses several methods to conduct interviews with candidates, which range from video interviewing technology through to over the telephone or in-person meetings. Regardless of the method of interview, we will ask you about specific occasions when you have demonstrated a particular ability. It is important that you identify and know your strengths and be prepared to give examples of when you have demonstrated relevant skills. Focus on your role in these situations and the outcomes. These examples don't have to be drawn from work. For each example, explain the situation you faced; the specific task required; the action that you took; and the result of this action.

#### What are STAR questions?

STAR questions are extremely structured behavioral interview questions where answers are provided by explaining the Situation, Task, Action, and Result of a particular topic are provided to the interviewer.

### Competency and Strength examples

#### Competency questions

- Tell us about a time you had to adjust your communication approach to suit a particular audience.
- Give an example of a time when you had to make a difficult decision
- Describe a situation when you assumed the role of leader. Were there any challenges, and how did you address them?
- Give me an example of a time when you were particularly successful.
- Describe a situation in which you were working as part of a team. How did you make a contribution?

#### Strength Questions

- What are you good at?
- Do you prefer to start tasks or finish them?
- What have been some of your biggest achievements and how have you made them happen?
- What is your biggest development area?
- What type of things give you energy?

## Interviews - Purpose

Interviews should not be viewed simply as a one sided process.

Every interview should be treated as a **two-way** conversation, with each party using it as a way to identify if the opportunity is right for them. What should each party look for?

**Employer** – to see if the candidate is right for the company, what they can bring to the company and role and to assess whether their skills, qualifications and career ambitions align with the position.

**Candidate** – to see if the role and the company is right for them, what career path, progression, and training is on offer. Explore the working environment, culture, location and salary to see if it is a fit. Consider the short, medium and long term implications.

A **good interview** will allow you the platform to find out more about the business, role and culture. A **bad interview** often will come across as false, one sided or even an interrogation!









