

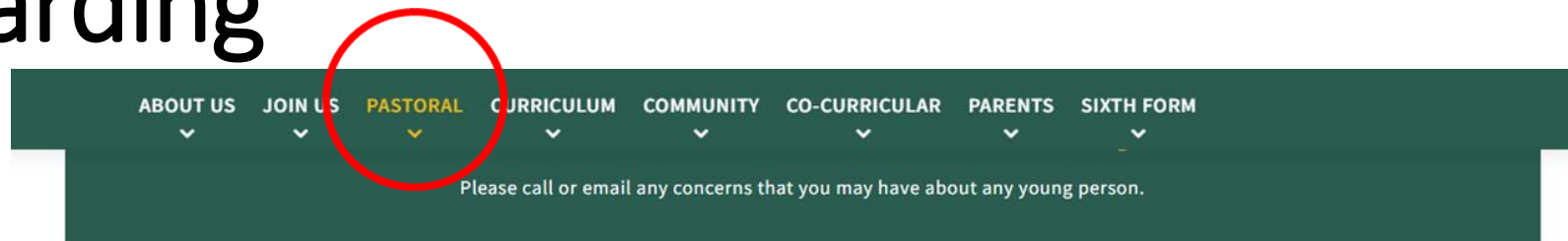


Prep expectations
